## **Anticipated Outcomes**

INCREASE Admitted student yield (admit to enroll in admitted term) to 70% by Fall 2025

INCREASE Fall-to-spring retention rate to 80% (new first-time-degree-seeking students) by Spring 2026.

 Specifically, INCREASE rate for Black and Latinx (new first-time-degree-seeking students) from 70% to 80%

INCREASE On-time credit accumulation for all students from 31% to 50% by Fall 2025.

- o Specifically, INCREASE credit accumulation for <u>Latinx students</u> from 17% to **50%** by Fall 2025
- $\circ~$  Specifically, <code>INCREASE</code> credit accumulation for <code>Black</code> students from 13% to 50% by Fall 2025.

INCREASE Fall-to-fall retention for all first-time degree-seeking students of color to 51% by Fall 2025

INCREASE Number of students participating in <u>work-based experiences</u> while enrolled at HCC from 23% to **25%**

#### STRATEGIC PLAN REFRESH

President Royal provided an update on our Strategic Plan Refresh, as this is the last year of the current plan. It is being called a refresh because we want to differentiate this from the comprehensive process that the College went through in 2017. The areas of focus will be to review our values and student experience,

	while engaging the College in this process. We will enact a Strategic Plan Committee and call for volunteers. We will also be updating our SWOT Analysis.
75 <sup>th</sup> CELEBRATION	Vice President Amanda Sbriscia provided an update on the upcoming marketing
UPDATE	campaign for the 75 <sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the College.
	Marketing has created a 75th anniversary logo, as well as a 75th Zoom background and email signature graphic. We are running two 75th anniversary billboards (in English and in Spanish) from August - October 2021, a 75th anniversary ad in BusinessWest in September, and are in the midst of creating a 75th anniversary website and two 75th anniversary editions of the Alumni magazine that will run in the year ahead.
ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR FY 2022	President Royal provided an update on ways the College has been focused on to get state funding support and move initiatives forward. Both our State Representative and State Senator submitted earmarks on the College's behalf. Senator Lessor put forth and was approved, \$100,000 to support child watch iniatives to meets the needs of our students. Vice President Sbriscia noted that we will allocate \$20,00 to specifically address the childcare needs for the Fall semester through the Foundation.
	Representative Duffy put forth and was approved, \$50,000 to support the building and implementation of a manufacturing program at HCC. Vice President Jeff Hayden further described the cohorts for the upcoming year and we will be able will help 60 people get into entry level positions within manufacturing.
SHARED GOVERNANCE UPDATE	President Royal discussed one of the priorities for the coming year is the modification of our college governance model, which was stated in our NECHE report. We aspire to have a model that represents all classifications of employees, as well as students.
