PAYING FOR COLLEGE

Applying for financial aid is **easier than you think!!!** The HCC Financial Aid Office is here to help you! You can apply and submit federal financial aid forms directly from our office computer.

Access to Financial Aid

Fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- The FAFSA is submitted electronically www.fafsa.ed.gov
- Self-service computers available in the Financial Aid Office (FR 201)

Meet Deadlines

- HCC has a financial aid priority deadline (May 1st)
- If you missed the May 1st FAFSA deadline, you should apply NOW!
- Same FAFSA deadlines are in effect for spring semester.

Don't forget that in addition you should:

- Promptly respond to all requests for additional information.
- Sign and return all award letters offering aid.
- Notify the financial aid office about funding from another source (i.e. Scholarship organization)

Keeping Financial Aid

You must maintain specific academic standards to be eligible for financial aid.

To be eligible for financial aid you must make "Satisfactory Academic Progress" (SAP) as defined by federal guidelines and HCC policy. The SAP policy requires you to maintain a certain GPA and also successfully complete **two-thirds** of the coursework attempted.

There is a limit for how long you can receive financial aid.

There is a financial aid policy that requires you to complete your program of study with 150% of the time normally required to complete the degree or certificate.

You can lose some of your financial aid if you withdraw from ALL courses. Did you know?

- Students **must** apply for financial aid each academic year.
- You do not have to be a full-time student to receive financial aid.
- You can receive a student loan even if you do not demonstrate "need" on the FAFSA.
- You may receive more financial aid than the cost of your tuition, fees, and books.
- Financial aid cannot pay for your books or health insurance without your permission.
- A "W" (withdrawal) doesn't affect you GPA, but an "F" (fail) does and either one may put your Financial Aid in jeopardy.

PARKING

Parking Rules and Regulations www.hcc.edu/about-hcc/visit-hcc/parking-at-hcc/parking-regulations can be found online. Parking is allowed for students in designated lots and within lined areas only (not on curbs, grass, or snow banks) as listed below:

From 6:00 am to 4:00 pm

- STUDENTS: Lots A, B, C, D, M, N, O, P, Q, R, and S
- D-Lot is a car pool lot until 10 am need more than one person in vehicle
- Q-Lot has shuttle, M-F 7:00 am 4 pm

From 4:00 pm to 11:00 pm

- STUDENTS: Lots A, B, C, D, E, F, H, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, and S
- DISABLED PARKING: G-Lot-BY PERMIT ONLY

VISITORS LOTS: No student parking allowed anytime.
