He updated the Board on the on-campus interviews happening this week for the new position of Vice President of People, Culture and Equity. There are four finalists that will visit campus. He offered thanks to Co-Chairs Alan Bloomgarden and Raishad Glover for their work with the Search Committee.

The College has been awarded \$375,000 from the Capital Skills grant to purchase updated equipment for the simulation center at the Center for Health Education..

In addition, the College received \$230,000 from the Higher Innovation Fund for Equity Ambassadors.

Congratulations to Dr. Ileana Vasue for the successful coordination of the ARISE Conference held in April. The focus of the Conference was to promot collaboration to advance research and vision. There were 90 attendance – 39% were students sand 25% of the speakers were students.

Congratulations to Tom Stewart on receiving the 2024 George E. Killian Award of Excellence, the highest award bestowed each year by the National Junior College Athletic Association.




