PRESIDENTIAL SELECTION:		ed an overview and summary of the search process: 2, the College signed a contract with The Pauly Group,

- represented by Angela Provart, President.
- November 2022, Search Committee was formed with 21 members; and meetings were held on campus with constituency groups.
- December 2022, the Position Profile was approved by the Community and the Board of Trustees, and published at the end of December.
- January 2023, applications were received.
- February 20, 2023, the posting closed; and the Committee evaluated the 50 applications.
- March 2, 2023, the Committee identified nine semi-finalists.
- March 22, 23, and 24, 2023, the Committee interviewed the nine semi-finalists; and selected four finalists to visit the campus.
- April 6, 10, 11 and 13, 2023, the four finalists participated in an all-day visit on campus with constituencies from across campus, that included a Zoom interview with Commissioner Ortega and the Secretary of Education, and ended the day with an interview and dinner with Trustees.

Trustee Williams reported that the Search Committee has completed their review of applicants and reported to the Board the following four candidates to be considered for election as our fifth President:

- Noemi Custodia Lora
- Tony Hawkins
- Arlene Rodriguez
- George Timmons

Chair Gilbert informed the Board that the presidential selection decision will include two phases: First, the Board will deliberate over the candidates with each Board member being called upon in alphabetical order and each will have the opportunity to identify and discuss his/her top candidate for the position. During this phase, no vote will be taken. Second, following the Board's deliberations, a vote will be taken to select the next President of Holyoke Community College. All deliberations will be conducted in open session. At the conclusion of the Board's deliberations, Chair Gilbert has the discretion to ask for further deliberation and discussion or ask for a motion to end deliberations. He then invited Karen Desjeans, as the Board Liaison, to proceed by calling on the Trustees in alphabetical order to begin the deliberative process. Chair Gilbert asked each Trustee to select the candidate they feel is their number one.
