Art exhibit explores uncommon exploits

A group exhibit at Holyoke Community College's Taber Art Gallery celebrates the non-traditional milestones in life that are often overlooked.

The "Uncommon Merits & Awards Art Exhibition" runs until Oct. 26 and features the work of 18 New England artists who answered an open call for submissions.

"We all know it is standard to win prizes for anything from best in show to a commendation for valor on the battlefield," said gallery director Amy Johnquest, who co-curated the show with artist Jill St. Croeur, of Florence.

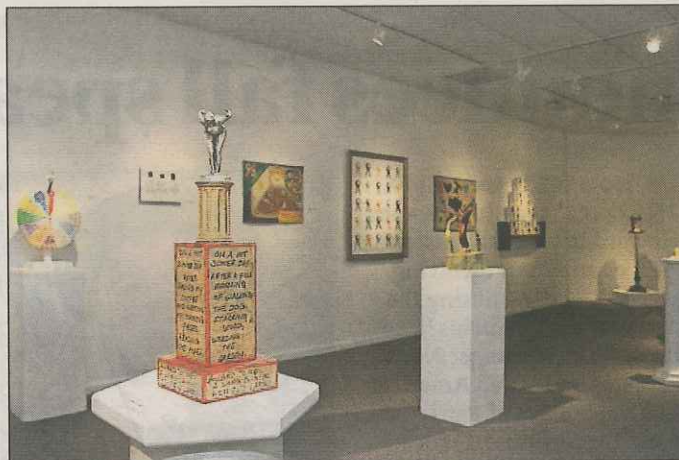

An interactive part of the exhibition invites visitors to invent and display their own certificates of merit.

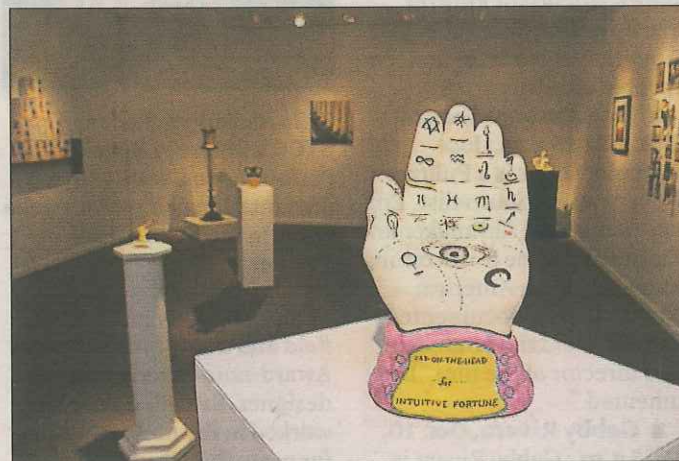
The 18 contributing artists are: Robert Markey, Ashfield (sculpture); Elizabeth Solo-
